Salem Shifting Earthquakes Shake and Wind Fuels Fire

Since the start of this century, conversations in the Christian Community have pondered what the church in the 21st Century would look like. A paradigm shift from Christendom to the church that reaches this age with the Gospel of Jesus Christ has yet to unfold. We are in the midst of a shift.

In the 20th century, the church operated in what is called Christendom. This refers to the organizational structure of the church where the church is seen as the central part of a community. The early years of the American Frontier saw the founding of churches as a sign that civilization had arrived. The churches were the central space for education, taking care of the needs of a community and creating the social frameworks that made our communities work. The church was the place that the community looked for leadership and guidance in how to have better lives to ensure a stronger community together.

As the 20th century waned and a new culture was birthed, transitioning from an industrial age to an informational and technological age, so did the transition come to our communities. Big box stores replaced mom and pop businesses. Downtown centers became ghost towns as a more mobile culture gravitated away from the small country villages. Isolated and impersonal lives became the norm along with an increase in mental health concerns due to a lack of relationships. The new paradigm is being uncovered as something not new at all. Rather the culture and identity of the church is returning to the old ways that have become forgotten. The rise of Christianity took shape out of house-to-house meetings. Personal relationships that valued and cared for a small community met the challenge of a changed world landscape. The churches of Acts had a practice that is being reclaimed today.

46 And they, continuing daily with one accord in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, did eat their meat with gladness and singleness of heart, 47 Praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to the church daily such as should be saved. Acts 2:46-47 (KJV)
