<u>Small Church Feel / Large Church Impact</u> Salem Makes a Global Impact

How can a small church in a small town in a rural area effectively change the WORLD? The way that this is accomplished is by being part of a movement of the Holy Spirit. Jesus changed the lives of 12 Disciples, and they changed the world. Paul met Jesus on the Damascus Road, and his life was changed forever. This change brought Paul to a witness that changed the Roman empire, spreading Christian faith around the world. John Wesley had his heart strangely warmed by the Holy Spirit, and he birthed a movement of Methodists that went around the world

This October Salem will host the birthing of a new North Carolina Conference of Methodist people. These people have resolved themselves not to build another institution. Rather, the people called Global Methodists are positioning themselves to listen well to the move of the Holy Spirit becoming a movement to change the world. The Global Methodist Church is convening the North Carolina Provisional Annual Conference in Fayetteville, North Carolina on October 5-7, 2023.

Salem has been the site of numerous meetings throughout this past year as leaders from across North Carolina have planned for this historic meeting. Over 2,000 Methodists from Murphy to Manteo will meet on Friday, October 6 to conduct their first organizational meeting. Salem will be host to over 400 Clergy and their families on Thursday, October 5 for the pre-conference executive session where Clergy will consider 138 Clergy to be ordained at this Annual Conference on Saturday, October 7.

Lead Presiding Elder Rev. Parker Coppock remarked, "I've not been this excited for an Annual Conference in a very, very long time." The sense around the state is filled with excitement as a fresh wind of the Holy Spirit is blowing through so many churches. In our staff meeting, Gary Wages stated that he had been sharing with everyone he knew that there is a revival happening at Salem. We discussed how you could sense the Holy Spirit in our worship and activities at Salem. This sense that God is doing something new is exponentially multiplied around the world as Salem shares in this movement

Pray for the Global Methodist Church. Pray for our members and pastors who will be bringing a voice from Salem. Join us in celebrating this new denomination in a Methodist Campmeeting on Sunday, October 8.
