Up from the Grave

Spring and Passover go hand in hand with their witness of life overcoming death. We are emerging from the cold, dark, death of winter and breaking forth with the new life, light and growth of Spring. This imagery helps us to see the new life that comes to us in Christ, not only in the now, but also in eternity.

We were lost in our sins and trespasses. The fear and avoidance of death consumed our daily lives. We were trapped by the dictates of our flesh. Death was consuming our lives. This is a very dark place that our world has no answer from which to escape. The imprisonment that the world experiences is very real.

Ephesians 2 tells us: We were dead in trespasses and sins, in which we once walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, the spirit who now works in the sons of disobedience, among whom also we all once conducted ourselves in the lusts of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, just as the others.

Think about the cold of winter. It chills to the bone. There are times when it seems nothing you do can shield you from that cold. Along with the chill, the darkness that this life of sin and trespasses brings is very depressing. The cold and dark winter can give a semblance of what death is like. It is heart-wrenching just to think about this place where the world lives every day.

Jesus came to change all that. Jesus brings deliverance. Jesus brings light. Jesus brings freedom. Jesus brings a new day and new life. Spring has sprung!

Spring is like the beginning of a new day. It always seems darkest just before the break of the new day. Gradually the sun's light begins to break and likewise, we see the beginning signs of Spring. Then all at once, the sun breaks the horizon and all at once it seems everything is in bloom. God has made us alive, who were

once dead in our trespasses and sins. We have become new creatures in Christ. We have a new nature that seeks after the things of God. Why? Because God was rich in mercy.

Again, Ephesians 2 tells us: God, who is rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, even when we were dead in trespasses, made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved), and raised us up together, and made us sit together in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, that in the ages to come He might show the exceeding riches of His grace in His kindness toward us in Christ Jesus.

Every week we have Preschool Chapel in each of the classrooms. We sing songs and I share a memory verse with the Children. Recently in Chapel, I shared with the children a seashell, a pecan, and a feather. I asked the children, "what do all these things have in common?" Well, yes, all these were created by God. And then I told them that they were created by God too. This new life in Christ is not about what we have done, rather it is about what God has done and is doing.

Read Ephesians 2: 8-10.

(8) For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, (9) not of works, lest anyone should boast. (10) For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them.

In this season of Easter, take a moment to realize that Up From The Grave, Christ Arose. Take a moment to recognize that because Christ is resurrected, you too will follow likewise and Up From the Grave you will rise. Take a moment to celebrate Spring. Take a moment to celebrate Christ's Resurrection. Then, determine yourself to live into the reality that God has created in Christ Jesus and walk in this newness of life.

She said that she is so excited to have a light to help her not be afraid when she has to run to the basement during air raids.

That gave me an idea. How about for the month of April we collect hand crank flashlights for our 200 shoeboxes?! They can easily be purchased on Amazon in quantities of 8 for \$15 or 24 for \$30. If you're not comfortable ordering from Amazon, we will gladly accept donations and purchase them for you! Do whatever the Holy Spirit leads you to do.

So what does a Stephen Minister really do? In a few words, they provide one-to-one Christian care to hurting people. The care provided by a Stephen Minister is defined by a number of essential qualities. Stephen Ministers provide high-quality, confidential care. For the most part, this caring takes two forms: emotional and spiritual support. This may be provided through crisis or long-term care. Men work with men and women work with women. In addition to grief, other situations that might be appropriate for care include divorce, job loss, illness, and spiritual crisis.

What don't Stephen Ministers do? There are three main forms of support that Stephen Ministers do not provide. These include financial, social, and professional. In these cases, the Stephen Minister will help the care receiver connect with the resources to meet those needs. Stephen Ministers also do not work with minors, couples, or families. Stephen Ministers are trained to recognize and refer those who might need professional care.

The ultimate goal of Stephen Ministry is for hurting people to receive the best care possible. Our current Stephen Ministers have been commissioned by you, the congregation, and are ready to serve.
