#### **Disaffiliation**

#### **Council Votes to Vote**

Salem will be joining the conversation and dilemma facing the United Methodist Church. The Church Council voted this month to put a vote before the Church where every member will be given an opportunity to vote on the issues of Disaffiliation from the United Methodist Church. Submissions are being made to the District Superintendent requesting that he call a Church Conference for Salem to take this consideration to the Body.

At Annual Conference in June of this year a process for disaffiliation was approved for those churches that elect on matter of conscience to leave the UMC. The process was shared with the leadership of Salem and consideration was brought before the Church Council on August 7. The Church Council decided that such an issue be decided by the Church and not a select few.

In 1968, Salem made the decision to become a part a new denomination in the union of the Evangelical United Brethren and the Methodist Church. It was a venture that has been tried by many. After 50 years and continual debates within the church around the homosexual practice issue, the United Methodist Church is parting ways with two groups that have taken sides on the issue.

The Pastor and Church Leadership are preparing presentations, providing links to information and holding Church-Wide meetings to discuss and listen as we consider disaffiliation. More information will be forthcoming. The District Superintendent has yet to notify us of our Called Church Conference date which will take place before October 10 of this year.


