Year-round volunteers support these efforts across the country.

In order to make this ministry most successful, contributions may be made all year long. Our goal this year is for 200 shoe boxes. We are still collecting hand crank flashlights that can easily be purchased on Amazon in quantities of 8 for \$15 or 24 for \$30. We will also gladly accept donations!
