## Salem Vision "I've Got It"

One of the most often heard phrases at Salem is "I've Got It." It usually follows the other most often used phrase before someone leaves the church. "Can I help you?" When asking people why they leave Salem it is because they do not feel like they are part of the church. They show up to help, but are discouraged when someone has already completed what they volunteered to do or are told, "Don't worry about it. I've got it."

There are no "I"s in TEAM. We are notorious for just working and struggle in our working together. Working together is hard. You are required to make accommodations to work with someone else. It requires communication and compromise. It requires maybe not doing it the way you would like to do it or even the way we have always done things.

Working as a TEAM is an intentional decision. You intentionally must make space for someone else. And we make space for others because it is at the core of our calling to MAKE DISCIPLES. There is only one thing a Disciple of Jesus Christ does. Disciples of Jesus Christ MAKE DISCIPLES. If you are going to make disciples, you must be intentional in what you do. Disciples that make disciples must give access to their lives to others and they, themselves, must have access to others lives that are Disciples of Jesus Christ.

When you say "I've got it" you are actually negating your calling to make disciples of other people. You must invite others to help you. Even when it is not comfortable, because God did not call you to be comfortable. You may help someone else learn something and you may learn something from them. Being a Disciple means that it is a requirement that in all you do you are working with somebody else. Be intentional in all you do to invite somebody else to help you in all your work around the church and in life. Never do anything without someone else doing it with you. It may be inconvenient. It is not about being convenient. It is about making disciples. And you cannot make Disciples if you don't have somebody else working with you.

So, the next time you have a task to complete, pray and ask God to show you that one person that you need to invite to share in accomplishing that task with you. Make the decision now that when someone says, "Can I help?" that your reply will be YES. Let's be those people that are followers of Jesus Christ that have heard the command of Christ following his direction, "Go ye therefore into all the world and make disciples.' Matthew 28:19




Salem's Mission to Homeless Families in Cumberland County"



## stephen

Stephen Ministry equips laypeople to provide one-to-one Christian care to members of the congregation who are experiencing difficulties in their lives. As a Stephen Ministry congregation, we're part of more than 13,000 congregations from more than 180 Christian denominations worldwide. More than 600,000 laypeople have been trained as Stephen Ministers.

Currently, Salem is conducting a training of Stephen Ministers. Ten participants began studying Christian caregiving skills once a week in August. The training involves general topics like listening skills, feelings, assertiveness and boundaries, and specialized topics like how to use prayer and other Christian resources and how to minister to someone experiencing grief, divorce, a medical crisis, or other life challenges.

The class is scheduled to be completed in December and members to be commissioned in January. They then will begin receiving referrals. Please pray for this ministry and for those who are giving of themselves to serve our congregation.

Salem has a history that began in 1848 as a congregation of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South. In 1939, Salem merged with other denominations to become the Methodist Church. In 1968, Salem voted to join the merger of a new denomination, The United Methodist Church. Salem has long been Methodist and long been connectional.

What ensued over the next 50 years was a difficult time of conversation for Salem and the denomination she had voted to join. Since that time the United Methodist Church has continually debated the issue of Homosexuality. It has been a very hurtful time within the United Methodist Church and has recently met a crescendo bringing Salem to a point of decision. The Salem Church Council voted on August 7, 2022, to put the vote to the membership of the church. The Pastor contacted the District Superintendent who then held a Called Church Conference on Wednesday, September 7, 2022, with 123 members present.

With much prayer Church Members voted to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church. The District Superintendent remarked on how peaceful and unified our church was in taking the vote. Salem remained true to the faith upon which she was founded in 1848. Salem has long been a presence of Christ's ministry within the community of Eastover. And just as she has through her history, she decided to remain in that presence that could be trusted with orthodox faithfulness to the truth that Christ died for all.

The future is very hopeful as Salem moves into a new connection of a Methodist people who are called Christian. Our roots remain deep in our Wesleyan Doctrine because they are the truth and plan that Christ himself espoused in founding His Church. The Global Methodist Church is organizing to provide a place where Salem can continue its connectional ministry. The new denomination looks forward with a scriptural basis of faith and accountability to spur on holiness in the believer. Pastor Gil states "The Global Methodist Church is the Methodist Church we always thought we were and gives us a connection of other congregations to be the MORE that we desire to be in ministry."

Pastor Gil goes on to encourage us all to be mindful of the grieving that will come. This departure from the United Methodist Church is not without loss of the connection we have known for 50 years. Embrace the stages of grief. Denial, anger, bargaining, depression, acceptance is real. Recognize these stages and allow the experience of these to help you work through the grief of loss. Pastor Gil is available to discuss any of this with you.
