# **Sunday School Launching New Classes**

Sunday School was once the only educational system in the United States. It was from this structure that our modern-day education system was birthed. I remember as a child progressing through the years in Sunday School. Many times, I was in Sunday School more than I was in church. This happened because we did not have Sunday Worship every Sunday since the preacher itinerated with our sister church.

It was in Sunday School that my faith was formed. I remember each of my teachers. I remember the songs we sang in Sunday School. I remember the Bible Stories that we read. Sunday School makes a difference in the life of a child and it keeps adults connected with their faith in the relationships they make in Sunday School.

Sunday School at Salem is adding 8 new classes to the existing 5 classes that now meet. Marie McCarroll and Jonathan Johnson have been enlisted to support Superintendent Ron Williams in leading our Sunday School. Our goal is to increase the attendance of our Sunday School that averages 30 students each Sunday. We believe that with the growth that Salem is experiencing that our Sunday School will grow to 100 in attendance.

Marie will head up the Children's Division coordinating teachers and selecting curriculum. She has a background in Elementary Education and will bring her skills to help us implement a Sunday School program for children that will grow our kids' faith. She needs your help in teaching the new classes that will be added. The New Classes to be added are:

- Nursery
- Toddlers
- K-2nd Grades
- 3rd-5th Grades
- 6th-12th Grades

Shelton welcomes any who would support him in the overall youth ministry of the church. Shelton has grown our participation of youth to an average of 12 in attendance drawing from a pool of over 30 youth in our program. His goal is to see this number grow to over 50.

Jonathan will head up the Adult Division. If we have children, there must be adults. New families and younger adults are our targeted group to increase their attendance in our Sunday School. With a place given for the children it will open the door for Adults to become a part of our Sunday School.

The existing classes and the new classes to be added are:

- Henry Murphy (Myra Roberts and Estelle McPhail, Class Leaders)
- Circle of Faith (Jonathan Johnson and Larry McPhail, Class Leaders)
- Winston McDaniel (Russell & Daphne Humphries, Class Leaders)
- Living by Faith (John Crawford and Ruby Bullard, Class Leaders)
- Young Adults Families with Children (New Class)
- Young Adults College Age to under 30 (New Class)

We are exploring an opening session with a donuts and coffee time prior to our Sunday School class start time of 10:00. The Opening Session would be in the church sanctuary at 9:30 with a hymn, prayer and devotion. Time to grab a donut and coffee would be before and after this time beginning at 9 am.

We also would like to reinstate attendance award recognitions for individuals as well as classes. The accountability of the Global Methodist Church will support us in growing our program. We plan to post attendance each week on the boards in the sanctuary to encourage our participation. Sunday School can help build the relationships we share here at Salem.

Pray about serving as a teacher. Pray about helping with the Donuts and Coffee each week. Invite others to become a part of Sunday School. We all have a responsibility to be a part of our Sunday School program to help it be a success.

### **CONGRATULATIONS COLLEGE GRADUATE**


Daniel Moody earned his Bachelor of Business Admin. Degree from UNC Charlotte in Dec.

Prayer should not be thought of as an obligation, something to do before we eat or a box to check in our list of spiritual to-do's. Prayer is a gift from God; it is a privilege. God is our Father in heaven, and just as parents want their children to come to them with anything and everything, so God waits for us to come to Him through prayer.
