### **Salem Methodist Church**

A Global Methodist Church Congregation

The new logo for Salem Methodist Church is purposed to launch a new branding for our future as a congregation in the Eastover Community and the world beyond. It captures a witness of our past and our future. Elements of the Cross and Flame of the United Methodist Church as well as the Tricircled Cross of the Global Methodist Church are found in the new logo.

The color scheme in red reminds us of the blood of Christ that was shed for our salvation and the flame of the Holy Spirit that transforms us going onto perfection. The blue is emblematic of the waters of baptism that births us into this new life in Christ. John 3:5 records that Jesus answered, "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God."

The two people on each side of the Cross represent a people in worship and surrendered to a relationship with God through Jesus Christ. Salem is a church that lives out the identity in the meaning of her name. Salem is a shortened form of Jerusalem, where the temple was located and the presence of God dwelt. The two people are also a reminder of all of humanity. It is reflective of where we were and where God has provided a place for us. We all are broken, and in Christ we all are redeemed. Salem is a worshiping congregation to celebrate the redemption and a sanctuary for the restoration from brokenness.

The Cross is in the shape of a sword resting in the open pages of a Bible. This reminds us of the spiritual armor of God and that the sword of the Spirit is the Word of God. The open pages of the Bible represent the Old and New Testaments. The Cross points to the primacy of scripture for faith and practice. The Bible is the foundation of our life together in Christ. The Arch over the Cross connects us with the Global Methodist Church. It is also a reminder that we are under the covering of God that brings a resurrection in a new day as we live and move and have our being in Christ. (Acts 17:28) Salem is expressive of all that it means to be a small church that cares and loves its members into a stronger relationship with Christ. She is also an expression of the large church in that we make a large impact and indeed are a Global Church.

Salem is indebted to the vision of Bryson Dexter, the creator of the design. Bryson volunteered to take on the challenge of a fresh representation for Salem going into our new year as a Global Methodist Church. His creativity captures so many aspects of who we are as a faith community. Many thanks to Bryson for this gift.

# Disaffiliation Update Salem Will Become Global

On September 7 the congregation voted to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church. The vote was prompted by the extreme move of the UMC away from Orthodox teachings of the church. This vote set into motion a process that was ratified by the NC Annual Conference on November 19, 2022. Salem will end its relationship with the United Methodist Church that was organized in 1968. 248 other United Methodist Churches were ratified in their votes to disaffiliate as well.

On November 9, 2022 the congregation voted to join the Global Methodist Church. 180 churches, that includes Salem, are in the process of organizing a new NC Annual Conference that will be affiliated with the Global Methodist Church. The GMC was organized with a design that listened to the concerns of the laity reinforcing Orthodox, Traditional Theology to the church. As the churches have organized, the excitement is building for a church that is returning to the status of a movement and not an institution.

The NC Transitional Conference Advisory Team that is organizing the new Conference in North Carolina voted to affirm the continuing appointment of Rev. Gil Wise to Salem Methodist Church. The vote also affirmed the continuing appointments of 140 other disaffiliated churches. "I am fulfilling a directive that the Bishop gave me in 2021 to help Salem get to where she wanted to be," said Pastor Gil Wise. He continues with, "It is my intention to continue to serve Salem through this transition to the Global Methodist Church to help Salem realize more of her call to be a church connected like family making a missional impact on the world."

Soon you will see logo changes and name changes as Salem rebrands. The cross and flame will be removed to make way for our new identity as Salem Methodist Church. See the related article on Salem's New Logo.

The Global Methodist Church is in the process of organizing. The NC Conference of the Global Methodist Church launches January 1, 2023. Salem will be one of the Charter Churches with this new annual conference.



Dr. Kenneth Haugk founded Stephen Ministry in the mid-1970's. He is a pastor and a clinical psychologist. He was feeling stretched really thin with worship services and providing care for his congregation and decided to train laypeople to do one-to-one quality caring. He believed there were people in the congregation who had gifts for caring that were not being used effectively.

In an interview with Peter Rosenberger on the radio show Hope for the Caregiver, Dr. Haugk stated that "A Stephen Minister doesn't try to solve people's problems, but gets people to tell their stories and really listens to and cares for them, which is extremely healing." Dr. Hauk went on to say, "The whole process ends up helping the Stephen Ministers." They get the gift of personal growth through their training, service, and from the congregation. He said this personal and spiritual growth was a wonderful byproduct of the ministry.

Please pray for our Stephen Ministers as they grow spiritually and prepare to give the gift of caring to others.
