

DEFIBRILLATOR'S
LIFE SAVING DEVICE
Installed at Salem Church

Two defibrillators are installed @ Salem Church.

One is located at the restrooms near the office (at the water fountain) and the other by the elevator near the dining hall (just outside the restrooms).

Generally, 911 will coach the person using the device, and the defibrillator coaches as well.

Defibrillator is a treatment for life-threatening cardiac arrest. Remember these locations as during an emergency every second counts.


Does this photo look like last month's newsletter photo?
