Gil's Call Story:

Coming Home to Jesus

"Longing for home when I thought Godwin was my home and then discovering God is my home and in Christ is all my family".

42 years ago I began a journey answering a call upon my life to serve God as a United Methodist Pastor. Upon graduating from Cape Fear High School, I found myself on the Methodist College campus, majoring in Religion. I could not tell you how I arrived at this place, with this major. My intent in high school was to find a way to farm and so I spent much of my time in the Agricultural Shop along with participating in FFA.

I spent the next 8 years in school preparing to serve Christ and His Church. Underlying that time of study was a continual trying to figure out how I began this journey in the first place. It was in the last year of my seminary studies, sitting in Duke Hospital in the Clinical Pastoral Education program, that God revealed fully my call. As I sat in that class, God began to show a movie of my life in my "mind's eye." I realized that all my life God was present all along and each event in my life was preparing me for the ministry of a pastor in His Church.

The hardest thing I ever did was to leave home. When the Bishop sent me to Norlina in 1993, I left the only place and family I had known all my life. In my leaving, I left with a promise God had given to me.

Mark 10:29-30

New King James Version

29 So Jesus answered and said, "Assuredly, I say to you, there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or father or mother [a]or wife or children or [b]lands, for My sake and the gospel's, 30 who shall not receive a hundredfold now in this time—houses and brothers and sisters and mothers and children and lands, with persecutions—and in the age to come, eternal life.

When I left home I discovered that my true home was not with anything in this earth. My true home I found was in Christ. Coming home took on a new meaning. Family with Christ meant that I was no longer limited to what I had always known. In Christ, family was restored and more so.

My family and I have grown over the years. Linda and I have three children: Joel, who is a United Methodist Pastor, Benjamin, who is a Finance Officer with the State Employee's Credit Union and Elizabeth, who is a Physician Assistant at the Stedman/Wade Family Clinic in Wade. Joel has a Salem connection in that he is married to Ray Burkhart's daughter, Jessie.

The witness of the promise has been fulfilled time and again as we have gained more family in all the places I have been appointed. So we are coming home to Salem as we anticipate our new family in this new appointment. My one priority in all the places I have been is to introduce all I encounter to the love of God that I have found in Jesus Christ. There are so many broken places and broken people, but I know the one who can mend the impossible. He is the light that dispels the darkness like the bright morning star. He is the sweet fragrance like the lily of the valley. He is my HOME and the one who makes all things possible. There is no other like Christ and there is no other who can restore my relationship with God and all of creation. It is for this reason that I have set my life to this one thing and why I sign all my correspondence:
