Casting Vision to Catch People
Read Proverbs 29: 18 Habakkuk 2: 1-4

Every Sunday is Vision Casting Time. For me, the people of God gathered share in seeing a picture of our ministry and our God that is greater than we can see on our own. When we come together, our worship and the WORD preached help us to see the vision God is calling us to fulfill. This happens because we take the time to take a stand in the tower, who is Christ, to see what God will say to us.

What is the vision of Salem? As I have experienced Salem, there is a sense of a small church with all the care and personal connection that a small church can give. This small church sense is nestled in a large church impact that reaches thousands of people in worship, in childcare and in community outreach.

This foundation of the small sense of caring and being large enough to impact greater areas is a tight wire to balance. It takes both elements to be the church that God has called Salem to be. One characteristic does not negate the other. Both complement and make whole our witness of ministry to the world.

Habakkuk reminds us that first our place is to take a stand in the tower. The tower is Christ. When we position ourselves in Christ, we begin a point of agreement that can change the world. This position in Christ allows us to see what Christ sees. When we have seen God's vision for us, the next step is to write the vision and make it clear so that those who read it may run. In the Body of Christ there are those that see the vision.

They are responsible to share the vision and share it clearly. There are others in the Body of Christ whose gift is to carry out the vision. These people tend to be detail people. It takes all of us operating in our gifts to establish God's Kingdom. It also means that we all need to be on the same page appreciating each other's gifts to accomplish the vision that has been given.

Our missions statement reads :

The Mission of Salem United Methodist Church is to be a living presence for Jesus Christ through prayer, worship, discipleship and outreach to the community.

Be the living presence of Christ by taking time to spend with Jesus. Then, live Jesus in all the facets of discipleship in which you live. The vision at Salem is one that has view of reaching our area for Christ. It is founded in a long history of love and care for the Eastover Community and the surrounding areas. God is still working in our "smallness" to do great things that impact our world with the Love of Jesus.

## Children and Youth Ministries

July was filled with learning about Jesus through the Deep Sea! During the week of July 19-23, we explored the Deep Sea in Vacation Bible School! We had over 77 students and 30 volunteers making VBS spectacular!

On the first day of VBS, we received our SEA Agent badge, learned about Moses and made an octopus out of names of people who can help our faith grow!

The second day of VBS we made fingerprint fish and learned that we are all unique and different. We learned about the story of the 5 loaves of bread and 2 fish and how God fed over 5,000 with so little. We dug through the sand in science to find the big idea of my faith grows deeper when I use my gifts.

On the third day of VBS we explored the Deep Sea by making sea creatures out of Play-Doh. In crafts, we made suncatchers and learned more about the ocean by playing beach ball bounce.

Day 4 of VBS we jumped the waves in games and played dominoes that represented us sharing our story in science. We also learned about a man named Jonah and placed fish on a fish net of those who can help us share our story with others!

Day 5 was our water party that consisted of a dunk tank, water balloon fight, slip n slide, super soakers, and a splash pad! It was a lot of fun!

Sunset Slush came and celebrated with us by scooping slush for all who attended and volunteered!

Throughout the week, the boys and girls raised money for our very own Salem Food Pantry. The boys raised \$649.38, and the girls raised \$993.13 with a grand total of \$1,682.51! Great job GIRLS!!!
